**Ordinance No. 115.**

An ordinance providing for a license tax on drays.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Hayti, Pemisot county, Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. A license tax of twenty five dollars per year is hereby levied upon all drays and vehicles hauling chattels and things from place to place in this city, which license tax shall be paid annually.

Section 2. Any person directly or indirectly operating a dray within this city without first procuring a license so to do as provided in the preceding section of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction fined in a sum not less than twenty-five dollars and not more than one hundred dollars.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

In the Circuit Court of said county, February term, 1913, Friday, the 11th day of the term, and the 28th day of February, 1913.

The State of Missouri, at the relation and to the use of Chas. R. Pierce, Collector of the Revenue within and for the County of Pemisot and State of Missouri, plaintiff,

At this day comes the plaintiff herein by his attorney, before the Judge of the Circuit Court and shows to the satisfaction of the Court that he is unable to have the within named defendants served with the ordinary process of law.

Whereupon it is ordered by the Court that said defendants be notified by publication that plaintiff has commenced a suit against them in this court, the object and general nature of which is to enforce the lien of the State of Missouri for certain state taxes, county taxes, jail fund taxes, school fund taxes, all which taxes are delinquent, due, owing and unpaid, in the sums and for the years set out below, to-wit: For the year 1907, \$4.62; for the year 1908, \$4.74; for the year 1909, \$4.87; for the year 1910, \$5.11, together with interest, fees and costs, on and against the following real estate, situate in the County of Pemisot and State of Missouri, to-wit: South half of the southeast quarter of section number eighteen (18), in township number twenty (20), north range fourteen (14) east, all as shown by the certified tax bill filed with said petition and made part thereof, and to obtain judgment against said land for closing said lien, and for said taxes, interest, fees and costs as aforesaid and obtain a special execution and order of sale for said lands for the payment of said taxes, collector's fees, attorney's fees, clerk's fees, interest, penalty and the costs accruing in this suit. And that unless the said Wm. Mitchell, Wm. A. Culbertson and Wm. Riley be and appear at this court at the next term thereof, to be begun and holden at the courthouse in the City of Caruthersville in said county, on the 21st day of July next, and on or before the third day of said term, unless further time be granted by the court, answer or demur to the petition in said cause, the same will be taken as confessed and judgment will be rendered accordingly. **Ordinance No. 116.**

An ordinance prohibiting the running a large of dogs within the City of Hayti and providing for their destruction when at large contrary to ordinance and imposing penalties on the owners or keepers thereof, etc.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Hayti, Pemisot county, Missouri as follows:

Section 1. All dogs are prohibited from running at large within the corporate limits of this city between the 1st day of July, 1913 and the 30th day of June, 1914, unless the same shall be muzzled so as to prevent them from biting persons in the event of them going mad or being affected with rabies, and any dog found running at large within said city between the aforesaid dates without being muzzled as aforesaid shall be killed by the city marshal and disposed of as other dead animals, and for the killing of each dog found running at large as aforesaid the marshal shall receive the sum of twenty-five cents, and it shall be the duty of the marshal to kill any dog found running at large in said city without being muzzled as aforesaid.

Section 2. Any owner or keeper of a dog in this city who shall permit such dog to run at large contrary to the foregoing section of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and punished by a fine of not less than one dollar and not more than one hundred dollars.

Passed and approved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen this 5th day of June, 1913.
