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BOOSTER ENVELOPES.

The Herald this week finished printing 20,000 "booster" envelopes for the business and professional men of Hayti, advertising the town, which order was made up by the commercial club. The envelope is made up with four pictures, the school building, city hall, depot and alfalfa scene on the front, and a description of Hayti and vicinity on the back. After the commercial club had made up the order it was turned over to us, as printers, to fill, and, by the way, we put the money up to pay for them, waiting for our pay until they could be delivered. For this we made no charge. It was arranged for us to print the corner cards on all of the envelopes. For this we only receive pay for the actual press work, the time of composition and distribution not being charged for. We did this for the benefit of Hayti, that it might receive some good advertising, and we did it at considerable loss, since the town will be stocked with envelopes for some time, depriving us of just that much work.

We regret that at the time the commercial club made up the order it was not made plain to everyone what we were doing for the town, for there are some few in this city who would see the town sink and go to hades before they would treat us with a Christian or brotherly spirit, but the commercial club did not believe some of our people were that narrow and contracted. The club was mistaken in one man, however, who cancelled his order because the Herald was doing the town a favor, and he is a "business(?)" man.

The work was completed this week, and we find many who did not order wanting the envelopes, which cannot be supplied. This order should have been for 40,000 instead of 20,000, but since it has been made and filled, the matter is ended, and we cannot again make the same sacrifice of our time and labor, to say nothing of the cash outlay, without profit.

A BLIND WORLD.

We stand about in our old haunts and try to keep on with our old ways of living, and speculate when the war will be "over," and we have not even begun to realize what it has cost us. The course of human history, as it stands today, is downward and very dark, in-

deed, unless our race can give MIND and WILL, now, unreservedly, in unprecedented abundance, to the stern necessities that follow logically from the air-craft bomb and the poison gas, and the silent, invisible, unattainable murderer, the submarine.
