NO EXTRAVANGANCE.
In 1907, with the whole world at peace, the Republicans gave us a financial panic. In the present year of our Lord, with the whole world at war, the Democrats have not only prevented panic, but have brought about unprecedented prosperity. Mr. Business Man, take your choice.

When the Democratic party took charge of our State government a little over forty years ago the State tax for all purposes was forty-five cents on the hundred dollars valuation. Today it is only eighteen cents, and two cents of that is for the new capitol. Meanwhile the State debt was reduced from about forty million dollars down to nothing, and no additional bonded debt created excepting the new capitol bond issue. If this record doesn't show good business management, what does it show? Extravagance? Hardly.

The St. Louis Globe-Democrat announces with considerable glee that "the actual war supply export trade has become negligible;" or, in other words, that we are not exporting war munitions to Europe. This view is corroborated by the statement of Charles M. Schwab that less than ten per cent of our steel production was being exported. But why is the

G. D. so happy over this condition? Let its own words answer. Here they are. Speaking of a proposed tax on munitions exports, the G. D. says: "This chance of revenue is gone." In other words, the G. D. smiles broadly and audibly at the increased difficulties of the national administration in securing adequate funds wherewith to properly maintain the preparedness program. But the G. D., in stating the foregoing facts, did not realize that it was sawing off the limb upon which it was so complacently roosting. That the United States is enjoying the greatest era of prosperity in its entire history is universally admitted. In their desperation at this state of affairs the Republicans have been charging that all this prosperity was simply due to our export of war munitions. But now, however inadvertently, the great Republican organ has been compelled to admit the truth.

The State of Missouri expends less than nine per cent of its revenues in salaries. This is smaller than the proportion of revenues paid for salaries by any other American State of equal wealth and population. The City of St. Louis expends seventy-three per cent of its revenues in salaries. This is just twenty per cent more than the proportion of revenue paid out in salaries by any other American city, and sixty four per cent more than the proportion paid by the State of Missouri. The government of the City of St. Louis is Republican. The State government is Democratic. There is but one conclusion. It is plain, inevitable and irresistible. Republican government here in Missouri, is more expensive than Democratic government by just sixty-four per cent. Let every Missouri taxpayer bear these figures constantly in mind. Republican spellbinders are apt to forget them.

"If we have a small and inadequate army and navy, the Republican party is 80 per cent responsible for its inefficiency, for the Republican party has been in power 80 per cent of the last half century." Clear, true and straight to the point. Who said it? Not Wilson, or Bryan, nor Champ Clark, nor any Democratic politician of office holder. No, indeed. The quoted words are the deliberate testimony of a former Republican cabinet officer, Hon. Leslie M. Shaw, formerly Secretary of the Treasury. He made the statement on the 26th day of last month. Secretary Shaw is simply stating what everybody knows to be a fact, and no honest Republican will attempt to deny it.

The last report of the United States Comptroller of the Currency shows that the reserves in the national banks of this country (not counting State banks and trust companies) are greater than the combined total of all the reserves in the Bank of England, the Reichsbank of Germany, the Bank of France, the Bank of the Netherlands, the Bank of Russia, the Swiss National Bank and the Bank of Japan. Yes, the country has done fairly well under a Democratic administration.

Walter S. Dickey, head of the sewer pipe trust, will be the Republican candidate for United States Senator. But when Senator Jim Reed hurls one of his thunderbolts at Dickey, the explosion of sewer gas will shatter to atoms whatever is left of the Republican organization in this State.

It isn't a good idea to "swap hosses in the middle of the stream," and the people of this country are not going to change administrations in the midst of a world crisis. No other nation on earth would think of doing such a thing.

Military Training.
Officials of the Southwestern Telegraph and Telephone Company announce the company has adopted a policy of encouraging, without in any manner coercing employees to acquire military training in the National Guard, Naval Militia, or Federal Camps. Employees who are members of the National Guard or Naval Militia will be permitted and encouraged to perform all duties required under general orders of their respective organizations as to instruction camps, training cruises, rifle practices and similar services. Employees will receive full pay while absent on such service, and in addition, will receive vacations on which they are entitled under general rules of the company.

Employees who desire to attend Federal Military Training Camps will be excused for that purpose as far as practicable without detriment to the full performance of the company's duty in the public service. Full pay will be given during such absence, but time so spent will be considered to include vacations to which employees may be otherwise entitled.

The telephone company is to be commended upon its adoption of a policy of co-operation for the Country's welfare in furthering the movement for the development of adequate defensive forces.
