## APPOINTMENTS FOR PEMISCOT YOUNG MEN

Below is quoted provisions of law which may be of vital interest to some of our young readers:

"The Secretary of the Navy is authorized to appoint 100 men each year as midshipmen at the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, to be selected as the result of competitive examination given enlisted men of the regular Navy and Marine Corps who are under 20 years of age on April 1st of each year it is desired to enter and who have been in the service at least one year by August 15th of that year."

The mental and physical requirements for these candidates are the same as for other candidates for midshipmen. The competitive examinations of these enlisted men is held on the third Wednesday of April of each year, and is the regular examination given to candidates for vacancies for midshipmen appointed by the President, Senator or a Congressman.

Last year 35 enlisted men passed the examination and were appointed. Thus it will be seen that the competitive feature is practically eliminated, and that any enlisted man who passes the entrance examinations for Annapolis is assured of an appointment.

To enlist in the Navy the applicant must be 17 years of age.

Any lad born between April 2, 1900 and August 14, 1902 who enlists in the Navy before August 15 next, and can pass the physical examination, is eligible to enter Annapolis in June 1920.

Last year special schools were started in all naval districts on February 15th for special coaching by officers of all men who had applied to take the examination. All eligible men who asked to go were sent. These schools continued until the examination in April. The same procedure has been followed each year.

W. A. (Skeet) Stewart is spending a few days in Memphis, visiting his parents this week.


