

BIG SUNDAY SCHOOL MEET TO BE HELD IN NOVEMBER

The fifty-sixth annual convention of the Missouri Sunday School Association will be held in St. Louis on November 15, 16, 17 and 18. The Third Baptist Church, the largest Protestant Church in the city, will be the main headquarters. So large have these gatherings become, however, that a number of other nearby churches will be used for overflow meetings, simultaneous sessions, and divisional conferences.

The speakers will include such outstanding leaders in civic, religious and educational life as: The Hon. Arthur M. Hyde, governor of Missouri, who takes a very pronounced interest in the religious education of the childhood of Missouri; Robert M. Hopkins, general secretary of the Bible School Department of the United Christian Missionary Society; Preston G. Orwig, associate Young People's Superintendent of the International Sunday School Association of Chicago; H. Augustine Smith, professor of music and pageantry in the religious education department of Boston University; Miss Hazel A. Lewis, elementary specialist, United Christian Missionary Society, St. Louis; Walter S. Athearn, head of the department of religious education, Boston University; and Miss Jessie Burrall of Stephens College, Columbia, who during the war, built up and taught the largest Young Women's Bible Class in America; besides, many other leaders of Missouri and surrounding states.

"Evangelism" will be the central theme of the convention program. In the very first session it will be presented in a series of three addresses: "The Individual Motivated by Christ," by Hazel A. Lewis; "The Community Renovated Thru Christ," by G. Walter Fiske, Jr., Oberlin College, Ohio; and "The World Prostrated Before Christ," by Rev. Charles W. Gilkey, D. D., of Chicago.

The last convention was attended by 2264 registered delegates from 81 counties and 3 cities. At this meeting 2500 are expected. Many counties are making up auto parties. The officers of our County Sunday School Association are anxious to have Pemisot county represented by a large delegation. Any Sunday school worker may attend. Reduced rates of 1 1/2 fare, on certificate plan, have been authorized by all railroads.
