

### CAN HARDING PASS UP FATHER'S NEW STAND?

Politicians See Reflection of President's Attitude.

Washington.—A question current in political circles here is: "Can President Harding refrain from taking formal cognizance of his father's recent declaration of approval and indorsement of the Democratic senatorial candidate in Iowa as against the candidacy of Brookhart, the Republican nominee?"

The prevalent view in official Washington is that the venerable Dr. Harding's announcement of his intention to support Herring, the Democratic nominee, embarrasses President Harding in that the father's stated reason for supporting the Democratic nominee may be a partial reflection of the distinguished son's true feeling toward Brookhart the radical Republican nominee.

Dr. Harding's statement that "with fellows like Borah and LaFollette to deal with, my boy has enough Bolsheviks with him now without sending any more down to Washington," has angered the supporters of Borah and LaFollette who say that the President may have thus adroitly attacked these so-called progressive senators over the shoulders of his father. They say, also, that the elder Harding could hardly be suspected of making so important political announcement in the very heat of the campaign without having acquainted his son in the White House of his purpose in advance.

Other commentators on the incident are of the opinion that if Dr. Harding has not reflected at least the deep down sympathy of his son in the Iowa senatorial contest, he has taken a step which the latter cannot ignore without assuming some responsibility—though such responsibility may be remote—for his father's announced break with his party.

Naturally Democrats are pleased with Dr. Harding's declaration of allegiance to the candidacy of Herring, the Democratic nominee, because it will tend to strengthen other erstwhile Republican sticklers for party regularity in their disapproval of the radicalism of Brookhart, whose nomination was thrust upon the G. O. P. organization of Iowa by an element which is regarded with increasing distrust by the regulars.

### CAPTURED NEGRO HELD ON 17 ROBBERY CHARGES

Poplar Bluff, Mo.—A. D. Howard, a negro robber, has been recaptured and is now in the county jail at Benton, where he will face 17 charges of house breaking and robbery. An effort is being made to connect the negro with the murder of Patrolman Willis Martin, who was slain by robbers a year ago at Cape Girardeau.

The negro has effected some of the most daring escapes from jail known in this section. His last escape was from the State penitentiary at Nashville, Tenn. He was making his way back to Missouri, where he wished to see a negro girl. He was captured at McClure, Ill., after a fight with four officers. Howard had two revolvers, a long-bladed knife and a razor. He drew the latter two weapons in the fight, but never had a chance to draw either revolver before he was finally subdued.

His largest known "haul" was at Commerce, Mo., where he broke into a house of a wealthy farmer and escaped with money and jewelry valued at \$3000.

### MANAGES AND EDITS PAPER ALTHOUGH NEARLY BLIND

Poplar Bluff, Mo.—Dwight H. Brown, editor of the Poplar Bluff American, newly elected head of the Missouri Press Association, although nearly blind since he was eight years old, edits and manages his daily and weekly newspaper. Through his secretary he gets all the daily happenings from other newspapers, from press dispatches, which come to his paper, and stories written by his reporters.

Brown had to leave school when eight years old. He studied hard, having his mother read to him every day. He never married and is 35 years old.
