

The democrats of St. Louis nominated Rolla Wells by acclamation for mayor, the 12th.

Is a message to the General Assembly last Wednesday, Governor Dockery, reminded that body of its pledges to the people of Missouri and urged it to lose no time in the fulfillment of the pledge to enact "a just and equitable law imposing franchise taxation."

HON. PETER H. HECK of Ste. Genevieve county, has placed us under obligations for a copy of the Report of Committee appointed by Governor Stephens to visit and examine the State Institutions of Missouri located elsewhere than at the seat of government. They report the institutions "well and economically managed by reliable, honorable and efficient men and women."

Extravagant Expenditures. The Fifty-sixth Congress will make a stunning record for extravagance in expenditure. At its first session it appropriated \$710,000,000. The estimated appropriations for the present session aggregate \$743,374,804, not including deficiencies \$30,000,000 which already exist and deficiencies of \$10,000,000 which are likely to occur. The total expenditures will amount, on this basis, to \$1,493,323,666. In addition, the ship subsidy bill and the Nicaragua Canal bill, the former providing for a yearly expenditure of \$0,000,000 and the latter \$20,000,000 may be passed, while the promoters of the Pacific cable project will not be satisfied with less than \$20,000,000. In that event the grand total for the Fifty-sixth Congress would be \$1,542,323,666. The country had "one-and-a-half-billion-dollar Congress" two years ago, but then the United States was at war with Spain. Now we have a war which we have frequently been told was practically ended several months ago, and yet the expenditures of the government show no evidence of decreasing. If the country is to be run on a billion-and-a-half basis it seems to be folly to reduce taxation. On the contrary, our statesmen should rather be looking for new subjects of taxation. It is evident that there is no such word as economy in their lexicon. The twentieth century opens very inauspiciously for those who have to provide revenue for the government.—Baltimore Sun.

The Ship-Subsidy Bill. The passage of the army bill has placed in the hands of the administration a great amount of patronage, which has been used and still being applied to ease the way of Mr. Hanna and others, to whom he owes compensation for contributions to the vast corruption funds by which the republican party controlled the last two national elections and has secured the return of numerous senators and representatives. The passage of the ship-subsidy other bold schemes of public plunder is the "paying dirt" these men are working. A very strong and comparatively respectable element among the republicans themselves avert danger in the radical programme outlined by Mr. Hanna, but the power of the administration has been sufficient to keep this element in subjection. So confident has Mr. Hanna become in his experience and success in the application of "commercial arguments" to overcome principle and patriotism that he has turned to the task of undermining the democratic opposition in the Senate by his subsidy measure. It will gratify our readers to know that this effort has proved already to be a failure and that through the opposition of uncorrupt democrats in the Senate Mr. Hanna will be compelled to abandon his worst measure for the present, or the President must openly support him by calling an extra session of Congress.—National Watchman.

Obituary. James Cullen Smith committed suicide at his home near Sedgewickville last Friday morning, the fifteenth by hanging himself.

His mind had been diseased for several years, but he was never violent, being afflicted with melancholia. As he had the perfect horror of the idea of hanging, his family and friends thought it best to not take him forcibly, but the time had passed that he would destroy himself, and watching him as closely as possible, but an unguarded moment came and he took advantage of it.

He was born July 18, 1848 where he spent his life, and was the youngest of five children—three of whom survive him; Mrs. D. B. Hill, Mrs. W. C. Leslie of Millerfield, and W. C. Smith of Teocoma, Washington, and leaves a wife and four children to mourn their loss.

He was a pious, hard-working, law-abiding citizen and a good, pain-taking, careful farmer who provided well for his family as well as the stranger who might pass within his gate.

While he never made any profession of religion, he was in many respects generally disposed toward the church and believed in religion we know from private conversation, and no one who knew him will believe for a moment he was responsible for his sad ending.

His remains were laid to rest in the Trinity graveyard by Myrtle Tie Lodge A. O. U. M. of which he was a member, in the presence of a large number of relatives and friends.

We commend his bereaved family, who have the sympathy of the entire community, to Him who is a friend to the widow and a father to fatherless.
