THE NEWS RESUME.

Negroes attempted to lynch William Carter, a negro, at Brooklyn, Ill. Professor W. C. Phillips was drowned in a collision at Crawford, Neb. The first bale of this season's cotton sold at Galveston, Tex., for \$23.

Justice Samuel L. Phillips of the Georgia Supreme Court dies in Washington City. Secretary Root issues an order to reduce the number of troops in the Philippines to 5,000.

The Missouri National Guard went into encampment at Lake Country, near St. Joseph, Mo., Monday. A boy baby was born to former President and Mrs. Grover Cleveland at Gray Gables, Buzzards' Bay, Mass.

The farmers of Kansas are faced by a serious crop famine. It is said to be an impossibility to get all the crops necessary to move the mammoth wheat crop.

George Foster Shepley, formerly of St. Louis, more recently head of well-known Boston firm of architects, died at St. Moritz, Switzerland, while traveling for his health.

The \$16,000,000 mortgage against the property of the United States Shipbuilding Company is to be foreclosed, if the intentions of the bondholders are carried out.

A powder magazine exploded near Parisburg, Va., just as a passenger train is passing 300 yards away. Two persons are killed and 14 passengers on the train are injured.

The car has abolished fogging with the cat-o-nine-tails and related forms of extreme cruelty and substituted somewhat milder measures in the treatment of prisoners.

Two boys discover a railway bridge had been burned away near Alhambra, Ill., and flag a fast express train to avert a wreck which undoubtedly would have cost many lives.

A verdict of murder in the first degree is returned against Alfred Knapp, alleged wife murderer, at Hamilton, O., and it is believed that he cannot now escape the electric chair.

George W. Beavers, former superintendent of the Division of Salaries and Allowances, has been indicted on a charge of complicity in illegally obtaining a Government contract.

Emily Brown, who was born near Appleton, Wis., has been crowned Empress of Korea. She was born in the backwoods, but was taken to Korea by her father, who was a missionary.

The Deputy Colonel, who embraced the body of Colonel W. J. Best at San Rafael, Cal., dies suddenly, presumably of heart disease. He had worried much over the charges of murder.

Police officers of Chicago have two desperate encounters with mobs, which try to prevent the Kellogg Switchboard Company from moving freight to the railroad depots. The company has refused to compel its employees to join the union.
