In 5 Years He Made \$87,500
 Republic, Mo.—Dr. E. L. Beal bought eighty acres in 1902 for \$60 an acre, and set part of it out in apple trees, including Stark Delicious, Jonathan, Grimes Golden and York. From 28 acres bearing in 1915, he realized \$12,000; in 1916 only \$3000; in 1917, \$17,000. With twenty-seven more acres coming into bearing in 1919, he received \$50,000, but the 1920 crop brought only \$5,500. That is a total of \$87,500 in 5 short years. He states that if he were planting a new orchard, he would set out 25% summer apples, 35% fall apples and 40% winter apples. He says: "A cared for orchard is as sure as any farm crop, and pays a much larger return. Missouri orchards will continue to show good healthy profits."


