### The Election

The General Election last Tuesday was a victory for the Democratic party over the entire United States. Almost everywhere Republicans were defeated, or were elected by a decreased majority.

With the helpovers the Republicans will retain control of the U. S. Senate, but the House will be about an equal with perhaps a few majority for the Republicans. New York elected a Democrat Governor, as did also Kansas, and some other Republican states. Al Smith, Democrat, and an ex service man, received a big majority for Governor of New York. President Harding carried the state 2 years ago by over a million voters. Jonathan Davis, Democrat, who made the race for Governor of Kansas on a platform of being a "dirt farmer", and against Governor Allen's Industrial Court-Law, was elected by about 12,000 majority.

After he had closed his campaign, he went home and was out in the field gathering his corn, when his friends came to him to notify him of his election. Smith and Davis were also both considered "wet" candidates. It seems that a lot of the "dry" candidates have been defeated. Mr. Volstead of New York author of the prohibition enforcement law, was defeated. Mayfield the Ku Klux Klan candidate for Governor of Texas won by 400,000.

In Missouri James A. Reed was returned to the Senate by about 30,000 majority, and the entire Democratic ticket has been elected in the state including superintendent of schools and the judiciary. It is likely that there was less straight voting in Missouri this election than ever before in the history of the state.

Rubeley has been elected to Congress from this district, and Cunningham has been elected to the state Senate.

In the county, local conditions affected the election materially, and a part of the Democrat ticket was elected. A. C. Roy being successful in the race for Representative; Rufus Cruise, Democrat, was elected Presiding Judge of the county court, and W. H. Cottengin was elected Judge from the south district, J. M. Hutsell, Republican, was elected Judge from the north district. S. A. Carter, Republican, was re-elected county clerk, and Geo. C. Murrell, Republican was elected Probate Judge. The other candidates in the county on the Republican ticket were not opposed. They are Elbert L. Rayborn, Pres. Atty., M. C. Coday, circuit clerk and Arthur Williams, Recorder of Deeds.
