MISSOURI STATE NEWS BREVITIES

Resume of Late News From All Parts of the "Show Me" State.

MISSOURI BUILDING CAMPAIGN

Plans Said to Be Progressing Rapidly for Great Undertaking at the State University.

Columbia, Mo.—Plans for what is perhaps the greatest undertaking ever attempted at the University of Missouri are proceeding rapidly here. The memorial union building campaign among alumni and former students of the university will be held some time late in February, it was announced.

The campaign will be nation-wide, according to Frank Rollins, chairman of the executive committee here and director of the memorial union. The alumni not only throughout Missouri will be organized to make the campaign a success, but those all over the country have organized for the memorial.

"We hope to have the alumni campaign late in February," Rollins said. "We have been working on the organization in Missouri and in the East, and plans are nearly complete for the launching of this great undertaking."

The executive committee here is composed of Frank Rollins, Dr. John Pickard and Fred Eldred, the committee working in conjunction with Odon Guitard, associate director. With this committee in Missouri, the other district committees are planning to cooperate. At St. Louis the work is proceeding under the direction of Dr. H. H. Shackelford as chairman of the committee.

"School of Methods" to Be Held. Carthage, Mo.—A "school of methods," under the auspices of the Jasper County Sunday School Association, will be held in Carthage on March 11. The arrangements have been placed in the hands of Walter Ober, of Joplin, county president. It also has been arranged to have at least one district meeting in the thirteen districts of the county during 1922. Programs for these meetings will be announced later.

Community Club Elects Officers. Brookfield, Mo.—The Board of Directors of the Community Club has announced the election of the following officers: President, Theodore Duker; vice-president, J. C. Tooley; treasurer, C. R. Thomas; secretary, Edward Gerson. The club chartered a special car to take its members to the Pike's Peak Ocean-to-Ocean Highway meeting, which was held in Macon.

Two Negroes Killed Accidentally. Poplar Bluff, Mo.—Henry Thomas and Frank Curry, negroes, were accidentally ground to death beneath the wheels of a saw carriage in the Gallop Pass Lumber mill here. The negroes were scuffling and bumped into the release lever of the saw carriage, which killed them, witnesses said.

M., K. & T. Shops Closed. Sedalia, Mo.—The Missouri, Kansas and Texas Railroad shops here closed down January 31 and will not reopen before March 1. About 700 men were employed. The Missouri Pacific shops have obtained their appropriation for March and the full force will remain at work in all the departments.

Loads Pipe With Bullet; Hurt. Hollister, Mo.—Albert Randolph, farmer near here, had his pipe, tobacco and cartridges in the same pocket. He filled his pipe without removing it from his pocket. Then he lighted it. A pellet exploded in the bowl, burning him badly about the face and knocking out several teeth.

Invention on Tractor Patented. Montgomery City, Mo.—Thomas J. Weeks, Montgomery City mayor, has received word from Washington that on January 17 there was issued to him a patent on an invention that will enable a tractor to work with a binder when the ground is too wet for ordinary machines.

City Manager Plan Loses in Sedalia. Sedalia, Mo.—City manager form of government for Sedalia was defeated here by a majority of 35 votes out of 5,151 cast in a special election. The vote was 2,598 for and 2,593 against. The League of Women Voters made a strong fight for the proposal.

St. Louis Nurse Accepts Place. Columbia, Mo.—Miss Winifred Tittman of St. Louis has announced that she will accept the position of visiting nurse for the Columbia Charity Organization, which was recently tendered her.

To Study Agriculture. Joplin, Mo.—Arrangements have been made here for an extension school in agriculture in Joplin February 7, 8 and 9. Special attention will be given to a discussion of truck gardening, dairying and poultry raising.

Fulton to Have Primary. Fulton, Mo.—The Democratic city committee has called a primary for February 21 to name a city ticket, including a mayor, city collector, treasurer, marshal, police judge and four councilmen.

TWO RARE ORCHID SPECIMENS

Central America Can Boast of Two of the Most Perfect of Beautiful Flowers.

A quaint little orange orchid, odorless, very common in Central America, is the Spidendrum Radicans, locally called the "Dutch Shoe" because of its fancied resemblance to a tiny sabot. The "Monkey" orchid, more curious than beautiful, has greenish, small flowers growing in thick clusters, suspended from whorls of glossy leaves. Great quantities of it grow on the dead stumps of the overflooded land forming lagoons in Gatun lake. A peculiarity of the Monkey orchid is that when domesticated its flowers do not develop fragrance until they are three days old. Another odd species mimics a white violet, not only in size and shape, but in the exquisite violetlike fragrance which the blossom gives out in the late afternoon only.
