### SAMPLE WHITE WAY TO BE INSTALLED HERE VERY SOON

FOUR POLAR OF PROPOSED SYSTEM FOR BUSINESS SECTION LIGHTS TO BE INSTALLED ON JACKSON ST. BETWEEN CLARK AVE. AND OLIVE ST.

Mayer Willard Potts and E. R. Locke, of the Mexico Power Co., met and discussed the proposed lighting system of Mexico Monday and finally concluded to place the incandescent lighting system, now in use on South Clark Ave. throughout the city as outlined several months ago. Mr. Locke will also install four light poles, with two high powered lamps, on Jackson St. between Clark Ave. and Olive St. to give the people an idea of the proposed lighting of the business section of Mexico. The White Way poles are of iron and have an artistic base with extensions making the pole about 20 ft. high. Two incandescent lights of high candlepower will be placed upon each pole with the top. Instead of placing the wires in conduits Mr. Locke proposes to place a single wire at the very top. This will stimulate all of the unsightly wooden poles in the downtown district.

Mr. Locke told Mayer Potts he was anxious to give Mexico the best lighting system of any town its size in Missouri and is working toward that end.
