THE REV. G. C. AKER DEAD. The Rev. Grover C. Aker, died Friday at Excelsior Springs, Mo. Aker, who was 85 years old, had been ill of Bright's disease for the last five years, virtually ever since he left Kansas City.

MEXICO BOY WOUNDED IN ARGONE BATTLE

W. T. (Bill) Goolby, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Goolby, of Fulton, was slightly wounded in the big battle in the Argonne Forest, September 26 to 29, according to a letter that young Goolby wrote to his mother, dated October 8, and which reached her Friday.

Former Mexico Business Man and President of the Ball Magazine of South has Been Ill Long. Claude Ringo, who sent the message of the death to the Ledger, is a son of A. R. Ringo, builder of the Ringo Hotel and First President of the Mexico Savings Bank.

Claiming full rights as an adopted daughter, and alleging that she had been promised the entire estate of W. H. Smiley, a wealthy farmer of South Fork township, Mrs. John E. Kerr has filed suit in Paris to annul the will under which the property was bequeathed, and to establish her alleged rights to everything Mr. Smiley owned.

Under the will which was made in 1896, everything except ten shares of bank stock was left to Mrs. Smiley. She died before her husband, having as her sole heirs a brother, J. R. Smiley, and a sister, Mrs. Susan Bridgford. The ten shares of bank stock were bequeathed to the adopted daughter, Miss Mary Hasenjaeger, who is now Mrs. John Kerr.

After Mr. Smiley's death, Mrs. Kerr and J. R. Smiley were appointed to administer on the estate. It is to prevent distribution under the will that was executed seven years prior to the death of adoption that Mrs. Kerr has filed suit to establish her claims to the property. She has retained Boyd & Barnes of Paris and Pat Cullen of St. Louis, as attorneys.

Had Pretty Home Wedding. In a simple but impressive ceremony, said by the Rev. L. R. King, of Williamsburg, assisted by the Rev. S. G. Wood, of Auxvasse, McKenney Phillips Guthrie, of Hatton, and Miss Mabel Pratt, of McCredie, were married Wednesday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock, at the home of the bride, in the presence of nearly one hundred relatives and intimate friends.
