

GARY EXPLAINS DISTRIBUTION OF ROAD FUND

Theodore Gary, chairman of the state highway commission, issued a statement recently for the purpose of correcting mis-information abroad in the state concerning money available for road building in Missouri under the commission.

Each county apportionment is to be pro-rated on the basis of the state high-way mileage lying within that county, not included in the state primary system and on the cost of those roads. The estimated cost of construction will be made on the basis of a type of road that will, in the opinion of the commission, be adequate to take care of the needs of the traffic that will pass over the road.

The law further sets an arbitrary limit on the minimum type of construction that shall be used on the state highway system as a 12-foot gravel pavement, and also provides a minimum amount of \$6,000 per mile on which the estimates of the cost of construction shall be figured. This means that in all counties there will be spent by the highway commission a definite sum of money out of the funds that have been set aside by the law for the secondary road system.

COMMITTEES TO MAKE REPORTS TO CONVENTION SOON

JEFFERSON CITY, July 21.—With the Constitutional Convention rounding into its third month matters are beginning to take shape, and out of the mass of propositions that have been submitted from within and without, the committees are gradually separating the wheat from the chaff and some of them will soon be ready to submit their reports and recommendations to the Convention as a whole.

Of the 29 proposals received by the convention suggesting changes in the present constitution, or additions thereto, it is safe to say that less than 20 per cent will be reported in the form presented and few of the multitude of suggestions will be used. Some of them have no place in the constitution, being rather matters for legislative consideration.

Of the 68 proposals before the taxation committee 25 have been considered unfavorable but they will still be open for hearings and may be treated favorably at a later time. Only a few have been decided favorably and the rest have been passed to later consideration.

A favorable tentative vote has been taken to exempt from taxation bonds, not only of the state but of municipalities, school districts or other political subdivisions. It is contended that these securities should be made as attractive for investors as government securities, which are tax free and enjoy a low rate of interest.

LARGE BARN STRUCK BY LIGHTNING

A large barn on the farm of C. P. Arnold, northeast of Mexico was struck by lightning about 11 o'clock Saturday night and was burned to the ground. Between five and six hundred bushels of oats and a large amount of baled straw were destroyed. The live stock which was in the barn was gotten out without being injured.

The fire was discovered by one of the negroes who work on the farm but it was too late to save it. The loss will be partially covered with insurance.

NO SHORTAGE OF STAPLE ARTICLES OF FOOD HERE

Mexico merchants have a large supply of staple articles, such as sugar and flour, on hand now so it is probable that the strike will cause little discomfort here. The car which brings supplies from St. Louis has been from three to four hours late every day this week. It is said that there is a serious shortage of sugar in many towns and cities and in some places it has been necessary to ration the sugar as was done during the war. It is improbable that this will be necessary here.


