

## GIVES DATA ON JEFFERSON ST. CROSSING

Walter J. Sannebeck in talking before the Mexico Chamber of Commerce Thursday noon in favor of the Washington Street Viaduct gave some very interesting figures which were compiled on November 17, 18 and 19, 1921. The weather was not fair on any of these days so the amount of traffic was much less than on good days. On November 17 it rained all day and on November 18 it snowed. The total traffic for these three days at the four railway crossings was as follows:

**Jefferson Street.**  
Number of Pedestrians, 5,625.  
Number of wagons 701.  
Number of automobiles 2,668.  
Number of trains 65.  
Number of times cars and engines passed over crossing, 73.

**Western Avenue.**  
Number of Pedestrians 1,398.  
Number of wagons 238.  
Number of automobiles 217.  
Number of trains 80.  
Number of times cars and engines passed over crossings 268.

**Missouri Avenue.**  
Number of pedestrians 1,474.  
Number of wagons 381.  
Number of automobiles 608.  
Number of trains 81.  
Number of times cars and engines passed over the crossing 101.

**Clark Avenue.**  
Number of wagons 271.  
Number of automobiles 291.  
Number pedestrians 1,249.

Mr. Sannebeck pointed out that there were 1,609 more pedestrians; 189 more wagons and 1,547 more automobiles to use the Jefferson street crossing on these three days than the other crossings combined.

The Jefferson street crossing is the only passable thoroughfare from the city limits of Mexico through town north and south. The approach to the Clark street bridge is too high, the Western avenue approach too steep and the ascent dangerous and at Missouri avenue which is the only vein out of the southwestern part of town, the view of the tracks is obscured by buildings.

## NEW TRAIN SCHEDULE ON C. AND A

Mexico will have seven more passenger trains according to the new train schedule of the Chicago and Alton Railroad which will go into effect November 19. This will mean that seven more train crews including twenty-four men will go out of Mexico.

One of the most important changes will be No. 211 which will leave Louisiana at 6:30 a. m. arriving at Jefferson City at 11:05 and 212 leaving Jefferson City at 3:15 and arriving at Louisiana at 8:30. This train was formerly run but was discontinued some time ago. It will be an excellent thing for the merchants of Mexico, particularly now that Christmas shopping days are near for it will allow many people to come to Mexico to shop who under the old schedule were unable to do so, conveniently.

There will be no changes in No. 25, 26 and 19 and 20. No. 9 and 10 will be short thirty minutes between Kansas City and Chicago and Number 210 southbound will arrive in Mexico at 11:50 instead of 12:15.

Numbers 16 and 17 will go between Mexico and Roodhouse, Ill., daily, leaving Mexico at 8 a. m. and arriving back at 8 p. m. There are two of the new trains.

No. 27 will leave Mexico at 4:45 a. m. and arrive in Kansas City at 10:30. No. 28 will leave Kansas City at 4:15 p. m. and arrive in Mexico at 10: p. m. Numbers 9 and 10 there will make only seven stops between Chicago and Mexico.


