NOTICE OF ELECTION.

For Increase of Annual Rate of Taxation to be levied for School Purposes in the School District of the City of Sedalia.

Notice is hereby given that the question whether the annual rate of taxation for school purposes in the school district of the City of Sedalia shall be increased forty-five cents on the hundred dollars of assessed valuation, as proposed by the board of directors of said district pursuant to the provisions of the statutes, will be submitted to the voters of said school district who are tax-payers therein, at the annual election, to be held on Tuesday, the seventh day of April 1908, at the same places designated for the election of municipal officers of the City of Sedalia, Missouri.

Those voting in favor of the proposition submitted shall have written or printed on their ballots the words "For increase of annual rate of taxation," and those voting against the proposition shall have written or printed on their ballots the words "Against increase of annual rate of taxation"
