Saul J. Cohen was among the Jewish graduates of the Senior High school. Through an erroneous statement in the last issue, his name was unintentionally omitted.


Miss Selma Brin, who has been visiting her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Endil of Henderson, has returned home.
