

**NEAR END OF UNITED DRIVE.**

**Campaign for Jewish Institutions Will Close Tuesday Morning.**

With nearly \$7,956,798 of their quota already in hand, the officials of the \$10,000,000 United Building Fund Campaign of Federated Jewish Institutions announced yesterday that the drive will officially close on Tuesday morning when a breakfast meeting of Chairmen of industrial teams will be held at the Hotel Biltmore. The subscriptions represent 7,475 individual donors, making an average of \$1,000 for each subscription.

"Success in the drive is in sight," said Dr. I. Edwin Goldwasser, Executive Director of the Federation for Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies of New York. "About \$8,000,000 of the minimum of \$10,000,000 necessary to restore and make adequate the Jewish philanthropic institutions of New York is already secured. Our thirty-three building projects make up a large program—the largest the Jews have ever undertaken, but more economical than thirty-three unrelated separate building campaigns. The fund will make good the arrearage of the war period and provide modern buildings and equipment for, at least, the next five years. This fund will provide the means of restoring and building the institutions into

a correlated system of hospitals, orphanages, homes for aged, Americanization, recreational, cultural and religious training centres.

"In view of the fact that every day the campaign is prolonged adds to the expense, we urge that subscriptions, which are payable in four annual installments, be sent in at once."

**PALESTINIAN JEWS AWARDED MEDALS.**

The medal of the Order of the British Empire has been presented to two Palestinian Jews who performed deeds of exceptional heroism in the campaign against the Turks. The presentation was made by Major General Hodgson in front of the Military Governorate, and was witnessed by a very large gathering, including the staff of the Military Administration, representatives of the Zionist Commission and of the American Zionist Medical Unit, as well as members of the various Jewish communities in the country. The recipients of the medals were Mr. Lova Schnerson and Mr. Yussef Davidesco, both of whom were employed in the Intelligence Department of the Egyptian Expeditionary Force. Mr. Schnerson crossed the enemy lines twice in disguise, at great peril to his life, and obtained very important information. Mr. Davidesco also crossed the Turkish lines, and

remained in the enemy's country several days in disguise. On his return he volunteered to go a second time, but narrowly escaped capture by the Turks, and was thus compelled to go back. The ceremony was preceded by the reading of an account of the exploits of both men by Colonel Stanton, who declared that they had both "exhibited conspicuous patriotism and devotion to the cause which they had at heart." Major-General Hodgson, addressing Mr. Schnerson and Mr. Davidesco on behalf of the Commander-in-Chief, complimented them on their gallantry, and said that their work had greatly helped in the defeat of the Turks.

**DENY JEWS ARE RADICALS.**

**Convention Speakers Protest Identification with Bolshevism.**

Opening the ninth convention of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America last night in the Temple Ohab Zedek, 14 West 116th Street, the Rev. Bernard Drachman protested against identification of Jews or Judaism with Bolshevism, anarchy, or other forms of radicalism. Congressman Isaac Siegel, a member of the House Committee on Immigration, investigating Ellis Island, also protested, declaring that among the deported there were very few Jews.

Dr. Drachman urged assistance to the Central Jewish Relief Committee, working among the distressed Jews of Western Europe, and asked for and received an official resolution of thanks to the British Government for assisting the project to make Palestine a home for the Jewish people. It was decided to undertake a national campaign of Americanization, 300 delegates present from twenty states agreeing to participate.

Other speakers were Moritz Neuman, Rabbi M. S. Margolies, Dr. Philip Klein, Dr. H. Pereira Mendes, Meyer Berlin, Saul Silber, of Chicago, M. A. Kaplan, Herbert S. Goldstein and Captain N. Taylor Phillips. The convention will be continued at 10 o'clock today in the Young Women's Hebrew Association, 31 West 110th Street.

**PROF. EINSTEIN A ZIONIST.**
