

ed the British Government for having sent one of its best Jews and Englishmen.

The Greek Minister in Jerusalem while visiting Haifa, urged the Christians to live in peace and harmony with the Jews, and to emulate their industry and tenacity in order to improve their position.

An international Medical Society consisting of 24 Jews and 12 non-Jews has been organized in Jaffa to consider scientific and professional matters.

Five hundred and eighty-five students attend the ten Hebrew Evening Schools where arithmetic, history reading, writing and conversational Hebrew are taught. Some of the schools are attended by young boys and girls who had to leave school early and go to work, but a great

number of adults, especially women, are enrolled.

A tract of about 3000 yards was purchased by the Vaad of Tel Aviv for the construction of a modern public bath. This land will be leased out for a number of years to whoever will undertake the construction.

The Jewish Council of Hebron is considering a suggestion to store a supply of wheat which will suffice for the needs of the Jews there for one year.

Hebrew was used in invitations for the first time by the Administrative Department of the Palestine Government, when Col. Bentwich, Senior Judicial Officer invited the notables of Jerusalem to a reception on the occasion of the second anniversary of the foundation of the Law Courts of Jerusalem.

The Jewish Agricultural Group of Hebron has undertaken to cultivate 40,000 fruit and 58,000 other trees. It is experimenting with varieties of European seeds, and is working on plans for vegetable and seed growing for home use and the market. It is also studying poultry-raising and dairying.

A co-operative group of 30 dairymen has undertaken to supply milk and its products to Jerusalem. It has obtained a substantial loan to purchase cattle and equipment.

Evening classes, attended largely by workmen, have been opened in psychology, bacteriology, botany, agriculture, Jewish history, cosmometry, ecology, physiology and socialism. Among the lecturers are some of the best known teachers of the gymnasium and other schools.
