Goldfarb of Brooklyn, Rabbi Max Drob of the Washington Heights Congregation delivered the eulogy. He said Dr. Kotkov's death at 36 was like the sun setting at noon. When he came to this country from Russia at the age of 20 Dr. Kotkov had to master a new culture, and besides, said Dr. Drob, "he refused to sell his soul for filthy lucre," but made sacrifices for his cause, for his people and his God. His death was a calamity and the entire Jewish community would mourn.

The pallbearers were the professors of the seminary—Drs. Louis Ginzberg, Alexander Marx, Israel Davidson, Mordecai M. Kaplan, Moses Hyamson and Morris D. Levine.


The trustees of the seminary who attended the funeral were Cyrus Adler, the acting president; Louis Marshall, chairman of the Board of Trustees; Sol M. Stroock and Samuel Fishman. Almost every Jewish institution and organization in the city and vicinity was represented and the entire student body of the seminary was present.

Interment was in Mount Armel Cemetery, Fresh Pond Road, Long Island.

JEWES ORGANIZE TO COMBAT ANTI-SEMITISM.

London: (Jewish News Service).—It was decided here to organize a movement for the combatting of anti-Semitism. The movement calls for the creation of a separate committee consisting of representatives of the Anglo-Jewish Association and the League of British Jews, as well as the Jewish Board of Deputies, which, being the most representative body of British Jews, would have more than one-half of all the members of the new committee.

DR. KOTKOV'S FUNERAL ATTENDED BY HUNDREDS.

Service Over Professor Slain by Robbers Held in Jewish Theological Seminary.

The funeral of Dr. Wilfred Phineas Kotkov, professor of philosophy and the Talmud in the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, who died Saturday afternoon from wounds sustained early last Thursday, when he was attacked by four hold-up men, took place yesterday afternoon, in the auditorium of the seminary at 531 West 123rd street. Hundreds of his fellow-professors, rabbis, students and friends braved the pouring rain to attend, among them Mrs. Israel Friedlander whose husband, Professor Friedlander, was killed by bandits in Ukrania.
