An Appeal to the Jews of Fort Worth

Dear Sir and Madam:

Sixty thousand co-religionists have just been massacred in the Gomel District in Russia. Three hundred thousand orphans are starving with a wild-eyed frenzy—and eyes turned towards America. Five millions of our co-religionists are in dire want, and you and I must do our share to keep them from the terrors of a death of starvation.

In the last few days seven hundred men and women in Warsaw alone have been driven mad by the lack of bread, when a half-loaf a day would have saved these wretched human beings—driven incurably mad!

For two years we have had no relief campaign in Fort Worth. For two years we have been relieved of this city our holy obligation; but the dying cries of our co-religionists now call us to our task. The time has come when we must act. We can defer our duty no longer. Our feelings, as human beings, and our duty as Jews, call us to their rescue—and our duty we will do!

All the other cities in Texas have, within the last six weeks,

held their ^{Committee} ^{of} ^{the} ^{City} ^{of} ^{Fort} ^{Worth} ^{Texas} in for this fund, and from our reports, they have not only raised, but exceeded the quotas allotted to them. Fort Worth alone of all the cities of Texas, has not yet come forth with its help.

Sunday night our campaign starts. Dr. Henry Cohen of Galveston will be here, to speak to us, at the Hebrew Institute at 7:30 sharp. We expect you to come out and hear him. You will be asked to make your subscription. The responsibility rests upon all of us, and no co-religionist in Fort Worth, will be permitted to shirk it—nor will he.

Beginning Monday, a committee will see every Jew in the city. If that committee is unsuccessful, another committee will see you. We know that no one wants to turn a deaf ear to the dying millions, and we feel that our cause is more than just. Never before has suffering been so intense, and you and I must do our duty, as Men, as Jews, as Americans.
