deep desire to aid in every way possible those who were fighting in the cause of their country and the Associated Powers, and the Jewish Welfare Board was only the instrument through which they sought to make this aid effective. I am sure that I need not tell you that all American Jews have always regarded the French Republic with a deep admiration, for of all the European countries France first bestowed upon its Jewish citizens full civic rights and liberties.

"It is therefore peculiarly gratifying to the Jewish Welfare Board, acting in behalf of all the Jews of America, to receive from the French Republic this generous token of recognition of its effort. May I, through your excellency, express to your government on behalf of the Jewish Welfare Board, its deep appreciation and gratitude for the honor bestowed upon it, and on behalf of the Jews of America, their earnest desire to be able to demonstrate on all occasions their gratitude and admiration for your country."
