County Board Proceedings.

Medora June 5th, 1907.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment of May, 7th, 1907, on above date, present, J. B. Stoddard chairman and Commissioners T. F. Roberts and F. E. Gorham.

Minutes of last meeting read and on motion approved.

The following bills were presented and on motion allowed and warrants ordered drawn.

12 o'clock noon, Board on motion adjourned to meet at 1:30 p. m.

1:30 p. m. Board met pursuant to adjournment, all members present.

Moved by Mr. Gorham and seconded by Mr. Roberts and Mr. Stoddard, that the Board of County Commissioners purchase the residence property of J. S. Snyder for the sum of three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars, said property consisting of residence and all out buildings on lots 13-14-15-16-17 and 18, in the village of Medora, said residence to be fitted up and used as a court house and jail for Billings county. And the County Auditor is hereby directed to order issue warrant in favor of Mrs. Gertrude Snyder, in the sum of three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars, on receipt of warranty deed properly signed and accompanied by abstract of title showing good and merchantable title in her.

Motion carried.

On motion County Auditor was instructed to go to Dickinson, information relating to the building of county vault, and other improvements to be made on court house and jail.

On motion County Auditor was directed to advertise for bids for the removal of all county property from the old to the new court house.

In shipping cream to The Missouri River Produce Co.

It will be necessary to follow the directions given below in order to have your cream arrive in the best condition:

- 1st Adjust your cream separator so that the cream will test between 35 and 40% butterfat.
- 2nd Wash the separator thoroughly every time it is used.
- 3rd Skim your milk twice a day while it is fresh and warm, and then cool the cream thoroughly before mixing with the older cream.
- 4th Before starting to fill your delivery can, see that it is thoroughly scalded and perfectly sweet and clean.
- 5th Keep the cream as cold as possible without freezing, in a place free from odors such as emanate from the barn, kitchen or cellar.
- 6th Ship and deliver at least twice in winter and three times per week in summer.
