The city of Prague, with a population of about 600,000, has only about 800 physicians, or one for every 7,500 persons. A doctor charges for a day-time call in a middle class family only 30 cents, or 10 cents more than if the patient calls on him in his office. For a night call the doctor receives from the estate \$2 to \$2.50, according to the distance. Only professors at the clinics of the two local universities charge more, receiving \$2 to \$4 for a house call and \$2 for an office visit.
