**WILD WEST "BAD MAN" SHOT AND KILLED YOUNG N. DAK. HOMESTEADER.**

Mandan, N. D., May 24.—Stepping back about six feet from William Osterman, from whom he had tried to collect \$10, Fred Winters, alleged "bad man," fired one shot at him from a .32 calibre revolver. Osterman died immediately, the bullet striking him above the heart.

The shooting occurred shortly after noon Monday at the Jack Crowley ranch, near Hebron.

Crowley and Pal Costello, a ranch hand, saw the murder and Winters covered them with a revolver while trying to mount his horse to escape. Crowley braver possible fire, rushed into the ranch house, seized a Winchester rifle and held Winters covered in turn until he gave up.

Winters has affected bad man regalia, high hat, wool chaps and dangling spurs and for a year has been engaged in gambling at various towns on the Mandan-Killdeer branch line.

Osterman, aged 23, single, was homesteading. He came west four years ago from Hancock, Minn. The body will be shipped there. Winters is being held on a charge of first degree murder.

**CANADA TO HELP U. S. SOLDIERS' FAMILIES.**

Winnipeg, May 24.—Provision for families of American soldiers with the Canadian expeditionary force was indorsed by a patriotic fund conference today.

"There are about 6,000 men in Canadian expeditionary forces who have come from the United States and additional provision will have to be made for aid their families," said Herbert Ames, chairman.

Among the prominent Winnipeg men in latest list of killed at the front is Captain Frank E. Gane, professor in the department of classics in Manitoba college.


