NOTICE FOR BIDS FOR GRADING. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Board of County Commissioners of Golden Valley County, State of North Dakota, will receive bids for the grading of the road leading from the bridge which crosses Nutson Creek between Section 26 and 27, Township 143, Range 104 (Dehli Township).

All bids are to be enclosed in sealed envelopes and addressed as follows: To M. C. McCarthy, County Auditor, Golden Valley County, Beach, North Dakota, and marked "Bid for Grading."

The grading to be done and bids to be submitted according to the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the County Auditor.

Bids must be accompanied by certified checks for 5 per cent of the amount bid, payable to the order of Lewis Odland, Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, as a guarantee that the bidder if successful promptly executes a satisfactory contract for the faithful performance of the work.

Upon the award of the contract, the checks of the unsuccessful bidders, shall be returned to them; and upon the filing of the bond, the check of the successful bidder will be returned to him, provided, that if for any reason the successful bidder refuses to enter into a contract, his certified check shall be forfeited to the County as liquidated damages.

Such bond shall be issued by responsible surety, in the amount of the contract price, or if a personal bond, shall be double the amount of the contract price, or if a personal bond, shall be double the amount of the contract price, and any drawn to protect the County and any sub-contract.

The bond shall be approved by the Board of County Commissioners. Estimate of work, a distance of 200 to 250 feet by 25 feet at base tapering to 20 ft. at the top, and about 5 ft. deep.

PROPOSED RAILROAD.

The latest new corporation to spring forth in allon county is the Beaver Valley Railroad Co., with a capitalization of \$500,000,000 and the lofty purpose of building a railroad from Baker to Ekalaka. The stockholders and officers are: W. H. Peck, George A. Barber, C. G. Rickard, Frank Chandler, of Ekalaka; A. H. and H. E. Webster of Webster; G. Hetherington, Chas. Bise and T. F. Thomas of Baker.

The Baker Fallonite says the company has guaranteed that ten miles of the road will be built by September 1st, and forty miles completed in eighteen months. Charles Bise is evidently "the man-behind." He was in Camp Crook a short time ago selling stock in a Baker hotel company, and is making some record as a promoter. In another column of the Fallonite appears the following:

"The Beaver Valley Townsite Co., a new organization, was composed the first of the week and the proper papers were filed at the county clerk's office. Chas. Bise, G. Hetherington and A. Webster are the stockholders. The company is capitalized at \$40,000."

Presumably, the new townsite is on the line of the proposed new railway.—Camp Crook Gazette.

ANTS ON FLOWERS, LAWNS. Ants are often seen on plants. They do not hurt the plant but are hunting for plant lice from which they secure food. The plant lice everete food. The that ants like.
