Just How Religion Is Divided In Bismarck

CATHOLICS LEAD ALL OTHERS WITH TOTAL OF 1902 COMMUNICANTS.

Bismarck, N. D., Sept. 19.—The Religious Census, conducted under the direction of the state superintendent of the Home and Visitation department for the North Dakota Sunday Association, Mrs. May H. Tousley, has been completed, and shows that there are 38 different religious sects in the city. The Commercial Club of Carrington seems to have gone a long way in solving the problem of eliminating street beggars and grafters. The Independent has this to say of the plan, which appear to be logical and is said to be working well:

"The Commercial club in Carrington maintains a committee on charities. It was planned to have this committee wait upon citizens and receive in a lump sum whatever any individual wishes to contribute to charity for the year. Then all beggars were to be referred to this committee, and if their case was found worthy, receive a lump sum from the fund. The committee has not accumulated the fund, however, but asks that citizens refer beggars to them that their claims may be investigated. If found worthy, a letter will be issued and individuals can then contribute as much as they desire.

Experience has demonstrated that only a few of the people soliciting aid are worthy of it. Most of them are grafters, pure and simple, and make a good living from their work because the average business man will not take time to investigate the case."

PROPOSAL TO CONSTRUCT TRUNK SEWER TO SERVE ENTIRE CITY

City Council Holds Special Session to Consider Project and Place Proposition Before Voters At Next Election.

The advisability of building a trunk sewer system that will give service to the entire city at this time and be sufficient for many years to come, was considered at a special meeting of the City Council last night. The meeting was called by Mayor Platou in order that the proposition may be duly considered, and, if favored by the council, placed before the voters at the election in November, thus saving the expense of a special election. The proposed trunk sewer for the district north of the river will run along Main street west to Tenth avenue, thence south to the Sheyenne river, emptying below the rapids. The sewer will be of sufficient depth so that all portions of the city, below the grade of present laterals and compelled to use cess pools, may have connection.

Siphon Under River. Sewage on the south side of the river is to be taken care of by another trunk and siphoned under the river near the rapids and emptied into the main trunk at Tenth avenue where it runs along the river bank. The siphon is necessary to avoid a deep cut on the east side of the river and acquiring property rights.

In connection with the plan it is proposed to place a dam at the rapids which will raise the Sheyenne river one and one-half feet. The emptying of all sewage into the river below the mill dam will be stopped and the river made attractive for boating around the city park. The raising of weeds and growth in the river and a flood gate is to be installed in the dam so that the river may be flushed should it become necessary. The scheme is intended to make a pure stream of water from the mill dam to the rapids.

Estimate Cost. The trunk sewer, will be 42 or 48 inches in diameter, sufficiently large in the opinion of the authorities, to take care of the city for many years. The estimated cost as prepared by City Engineer Myhre was given on three specifications: First, vitrified pipe, 42 inches, \$44,143. Second, vitrified block, 48 inches, \$39,412.

Third, reinforced concrete, 48 inches, \$38,665.

The proposal is to vote a bond issue at the next election to cover the cost of construction. After going over the plans the council named a committee, composed of Mayor Platou, City Attorney Englert, City Engineer Myhre, Aldermen O'Malley, Lee and Clark, to further consider the plans and specifications and report to the council at its next regular meeting so that notification may be published in time to place the question before the people at the November election.
