Moved by Alderman Thomson, seconded by Alderman Hoiland, that a committee of two be appointed by the mayor to call upon the county commissioners regarding having repaired the wagon crossings of the Street & Interurban Railway Co., located between the city limits and the Soo Railway Co. depot. Motion carried. The mayor appointed as such committee, Aldermen Thomson and Curren. Supt. Burbank stated to the council that on account of a bad leak at the power house it would be necessary to turn off the water supply for a period of about four hours in order to repair the same, and asked permission to do so. Moved by Alderman Lee, seconded by Alderman Krogh, that the request of Supt. Burbank be granted. Motion carried. Bid for printing the city ordinances in paper book form was received from the Times-Record Printing Co., as follows: 200 copies, per page—\$1.00. 300 copies, per page—\$1.10. 400 copies, per page—\$1.20. Moved by Alderman Clark, seconded by Alderman Lee, that the bid of the Times-Record Printing Co. be referred to a committee of three to be appointed by the mayor, to investigate and ascertain whether or not the prices quoted in the bid are reasonable. Motion carried. The mayor appointed as such committee, Aldermen Clark, Krogh and O'Malley. The bond of the Haggart Construction Co. in the sum of \$1,000.00, with the Dakota Trust Co. of Fargo, N. D. as surety, for the construction of the Sixth avenue water main, was presented, and on motion same was approved and ordered placed on file. On motion the meeting adjourned. L. S. PLATOU, Mayor. M.
