

HORRIBLE DEATH OF YOUNG CHILD-- MANGLED BY MANURE SPREADER

Caught in Spikes of Distributor Young Girl is Fatally Injured at Fairmount.

Fairmount, N. D., March 1.—This community was greatly shocked on Thursday afternoon by the horrible details of the death of May Swanson, 11 year old daughter of Matt Swanson, a farmer living two miles north-east of DeLong. The little girl had accompanied her father, who was working with a manure spreader. At the time of the accident she was behind the machine with her father not aware of her presence. When the machine started the little girl was caught and mortal injuries inflicted from which death ensued in a short time. The father was almost inconsolable after the accident. He is one of the substantial farmers of Orange township and owns a farm in the township.

The accident occurred about 3:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon and the little girl lived until about 7 o'clock. One of the spikes of the machine had entered the side of the face just below the temple and an arm and shoulder were dislocated. At the time of the accident the father was unaware of the little girl's presence. She was running along behind the machine and had one hand on one of the spikes. Mr. Swanson threw the machine into gear and this threw the little girl into it. It was quickly stopped but the injuries inflicted were fatal.

Fair Association Sends Warning

TELLS FARMERS TO BE CAREFUL ABOUT TESTING SEED CORN.

It is not unusual for home grown or purchased seed corn to fail to germinate. Every ear intended for planting, whether purchased or selected at home, should be carefully tested. Some good ears may be found in every lot of seeds. Only those germinating strongly should be used. The individual ear-test will help you find the corn that will grow. A fair test with proper conditions. To secure a fair test, keep the cloth on the germinator moist, and set the box in a warm room, 60 to 75 degrees F., for from five to seven days. Count the seeds showing strong germination, and get the percentage of germination of each ear. Eliminate the ears that show weak germination and those that do not germinate. Do not plant ears that germinate less than 90 per cent, unless absolutely necessary. If you must buy seed corn, buy it on the ear; then you can test and see what you are getting.

The above warning is part of a poster dealing with the problem of testing seed corn which is being sent out to all parts of the state by Secretary

Moore of the state fair association. The poster will be sent to all the county officers in the state with the request that they be hung in their offices where they will attract the attention of farmers. They will also be sent out generally to the banks of the state.

This action upon the part of the fair association is in line with its policy of giving greater prominence to its educational features, as was strongly brought out in the recent Corn and Clover convention. It is the plan of the men in charge of the work to be of assistance to the farmers of the state at all seasons and not merely during the process of the several exhibitions.

Another aid which the officials of the state fair stand ready to perform for the people of the state is to put them in touch with those who have high grade live stock for sale, and as they are brought in contact with these breeders at the fairs and otherwise, they are in a position to render valuable assistance.

Arrangements have been made for the rapid handling of the baggage from the Union station, and at 9:00 o'clock tomorrow morning the greater part of the furniture and books will be in place in the new offices in the Elk's building, and the work will go on uninterrupted.

Demented Man Escapes From Local Hospital

The pursuing party, which set out after him almost at once, found him finally, somewhat wearier, but entirely unharmed, otherwise. Apparently the morning air had acted as a tonic.

The man's escape was made by way of the fire escape, at the hospital, but the perilous descent was made with the greatest ease. In the course of his perambulations over the country, Schwerdler treated himself to a cold bath in the Sheyenne river, completely submerging himself, in order to cool off after his strenuous cross country run. When his bath appeared sufficient, he left the stream, and continued on his way.

**North Dakota Has
a New Tree Law**
LEGISLATURE PROVIDES FOR A
BOUNTY ON TREES PLANTED
IN THE STATE.

One of the North Dakota laws provides for a bounty of \$3.00 per acre for a grove up to ten acres. Anyone who plants and cares for a grove of trees not more than eight feet apart each way, is entitled to a reduction of \$3.00 an acre in the taxes. The limit is ten acres. This makes the growing of a grove a profitable thing. The trees will bring as much per acre as a farm crop. But the returns do not

come for some time. With the bounty the returns begin at once. This will also be the indirect benefit. This grove, if along the south side of a field will have quite an influence on the yield through lessening the effects of hot winds. This is a good law from the standpoint of the county and the state too, as the planting of trees will have an appreciable effect on winds, and especially when the trees planting becomes quite general. Every farmer should put out a grove. There is no one thing that will do so much to improve the prairies.
