BULL MOOSERS TO ATTACK HOGE LAW

Fargo, N. D., July 2.—The Hoge law, requiring that a party must receive at the primary election at least 25 per cent of the average vote cast for the party at the preceding general election, is to be tested by the bull moosers.

The Hoge bill was enacted with little opposition, at the last legislative session, the object being to prevent members of one party from registering under another designation to participate in the affairs of opposing political organizations.

The bull moosers are indignant. They insist that many bull moosers were induced by insurgent republicans to register as republicans in order to vote for Burdick for governor.

In Cass county, instead of casting 25 per cent of the vote, it appears that only about half that percentage has been voted.
