

TISING-TSU FALLS AND GERMAN CITY TAKEN

Both Sides Maintain They Are Driving the Foe Before Them—Russian War Office Claim An Important Victory.

Tokio, Nov. 7.—It is officially announced that the German fortress at Tising-Tau, the military seat in the German concession of Kiao Chow, has surrendered to the Japanese and British forces. The Japanese navy co-operated from the sea and with the allied land forces.

The first step in bringing about the surrender occurred at midnight, when infantry occupied the middle fort of the line of defense. In this operation they took 200 prisoners.

London, Nov. 7.—The Russians report having driven the Germans back to their border in the north, and forced their center to retire from Vistula to Warthe river. The Russian general staff now has turned its attention to the Austrians, who so stubbornly have been holding their positions along the San river in Galicia.

According to a telegram from Grand Duke Nicholas, the Russians have won a victory of the most important of war in the eastern fighting. Russians say they have occupied Jaroslau, capturing 5,000 prisoners, and much war material. It is believed here, however, there will have to be another big battle on the Warthe before the armies of Russia can seriously threaten Silesia.

It was officially announced by the

admiralty today that the British cruiser, Goodhope, took fire during the engagement with the Germans on the coast of Chile last Sunday, and foundered.

(Previous Chilean reports said the last seen by Germans of the Goodhope, which was Rear Admiral Craddock's flagship and carried 900 men, she was afire, following an explosion. Since the fighting occurred in heavy seas, making it practically impossible to launch small boats, it is hardly likely very many of the crew were rescued.

An Amsterdam despatch says Berlin advises say up to last Sunday, the German concentration camps and hospitals, held prisoners 7,200 officers, 426,000 men—French, Russians, Belgians and British, the British being only three per cent of the aggregate. These figures do not include prisoners not encamped.

A Berlin wireless tonight states: "The German offensive to the northwest, and southwest of Ypres, has made good progress. At La Bassee, north of Arras, and in the Argonne region, we have gained ground. Our troops have captured an important position southeast of St. Mihiel, and inflicted heavy losses on the French. Nothing important has happened in the eastern theatre of war."

Paris, Nov. 7.—It is officially stated tonight that "to the north the fighting continues severe. According to latest reports, our defensive is proceeding in the region south, and east of Ypres. In the region of Arras, and from Arras to Oise, several German attacks have been repulsed.

"In the region of Aisne, we have re-

taken, to the east of Vally, the village of Soupir, which we lost recently. In Argonne the enemy keeps attacking violently, without results. On the heights of the Meuse, and to the east of Verdun, we have captured some trenches.

The fall of Tising Tau ends the most picturesque of the minor phases of the great world war, as it has been the scene of a combination of all sorts of modern warfare, air, water and land. For nearly three months the little German garrison, amounting to 7,000 men, nearly all reservists living and doing business in China, held out against land detachments and sea attacks. What the losses of the garrison are is unknown, but official Japanese and British reports indicate that Tising Tau had been taken at a heavy cost of men on the part of the allies. It was on Aug. 15 that Japan first threw herself into the war and started the campaign which terminated in the midnight victory, with the assistance of the British and Indians.

TURKEY NOW BATTLES WITH ALLIED ARMIES

Reports of Fighting Between Russian and Ottoman Troops Conflicting.

OPPOSING FORCES IN WEST FLANDERS ABOUT STATIONARY

Floods Caused by the Allies Prove Big Obstacle in Movements of Their Own Corps.

London, Nov. 6.—A dispatch to The Daily Telegraph from Odessa by the way of Moscow says that 12 Turkish and German transports carrying coal have been sunk near Uzunguldak, on the coast of Anatolia.

London, Nov. 6.—No decision has been reached in the battle in the Sand Dunes of West Flanders, and the opposing armies now stand virtually as they stood for many days.

While the Germans keep hammering away at the allies around Ypres, which route they chose for their march to the coast after they found the road along the sea barred to them, the allies are making an effort to move northward to Ostend, but neither side has gone very far.

The allies have found floods which they have created to stop the German advance, a hindrance to their own movements, although they have been able to occupy some villages.

On the eastern frontier, more wide sweeping movements are being made by the opposing armies. The Russians from all reports have driven back the German center to the river Warthe, Russian Poland, turned back the German offensive movement from East Prussia. They are now straightening their line for a more vigorous attack against the Austrians in Galicia.

The first reports of the fighting between Russians and Turks are conflicting. Each contender claims they have invaded the other's territory, defeating the frontier armies. These fights probably are advance guards of affairs, and is it thought here, some time will elapse before a pitched battle occurs.

Petrograd, Nov. 6.—Concerning the situation in the Caucasus the following official statement was made here tonight:

"There is nothing important to report concerning the operations of the last 24 hours. Our troops are vigorously clearing the enemy's territory which is occupied by small bands and remnants of Turkish vanguards defeated during the last few days.

"One of our columns defeated the Turks near Bazygan, routing them and capturing the town. Turks in their flight threw away their arms, scattered to the villages in the neighborhood. Our cavalry was attacked to the east of Dryden by three Kurd

regiments, supported by infantry, but threw them back."

"We continue to progress on the East Prussian front. The Germans are falling back along the whole front, only keeping a fortified position in the region of Wergbollwo.

"On the left bank of the Vistula, the Russian army is continuing its vigorous offensive, pursuing the retreating enemy. The crossing of the San by our troops continues with success. The Austrians are retreating."

Paris, Nov. 6.—It is officially stated here tonight: "There is no information on the operations north of Lys. In a violent offensive movement by the Germans north of Arras we lost few trenches, which later were retaken. "In Argonne (region St. Hubert) all German attacks successfully repulsed. Concerning remainder of battle front, nothing important is reported."


