

R. R. COMMISSION WANTS MORE POWER OVER ELEVATORS

Bismarck, N. D. Dec. 12.—At the coming session of the legislature the railroad commissioners will ask for the enactment of a law that will give them more power over elevator companies so far as an examination of the books and business of the concerns is concerned. It is said that under the present law it is doubtful if the commission can, of its own initiative, examine the books of a grain company when it has reason to believe that the company is in financial distress or insolvent or a probability exists that it may become so. What the commission wants is a law that will allow them to go in and examine the books of any of the companies without giving notice to the officers. At the present time the companies are exempt from an examination except upon the petitions or if the concern is a corporation upon the petition of 15 per cent of the stock holders. There have been a few cases this past year when if an examination had been much trouble to the commission and some loss to the customers of the concern would have been saved. The commission will also ask that law be passed to bring the gas, electric light and power companies under their supervision. One other change in the laws that will be asked by the commission is that the term of office be changed, by constitutional amendment, from two years to six thus making it possible to elect one commissioner at each election and obviate the possibility of having an entirely new board at one time, which could happen under the present conditions of election every two years.
