## **GREAT BATTLE RAGING NEAR WARSAW---GERMAN ADVANCE MEETS STRONG OPPOSITION**

west of Warsaw. A German wedge, proceeding southeasterly from Ilow, managed, after heavy fighting and great losses, to establish itself a quartter of a mile of Sochaczew.

The German column was met at Sochaczew by fierce resistance on the part of the Russians. The fighting was extremely severe, at many points leading to hand-to-hand encounters. The artillery fire on both sides was heavy and continuous. German aeroplanes are constantly circling over the town. Reinforcements are being poured in rapidly on both sides.

The Russians are bringing in troops by highway and by railway from Warsaw. The Germans are moving forces from the region about Lodz.
