New Church Dedicated by Congregationalists

In the history of the First Congregational church of Valley City Dec. 12, 1915, will go down as a memorable event—a day which has been looked forward to for many years and a day to look backward to in all the future years as one peculiarly impressive and important from a reminiscent viewpoint. It is the date of the dedication of the beautiful new structure and marks an epoch in the life of the organization.

For years the members of this congregation have anticipated and planned for the time when they could see their way clear to finance the building of a new church home. Year after year it seemed impossible to undertake the task until during the summer of 1914 the opportune time seemed to have arrived. Plans were formulated, a building committee chosen, a whirlwind campaign for funds, to which the entire community responded royally, was inaugurated and successfully carried through, and early in the spring of 1915 ground was broken, with impressive ceremonies, for the imposing edifice, which had been planned by Eugene McFarland as architect. It seemed only fitting and right that this honor should have been bestowed upon one of our young men who from childhood has enjoyed the privileges of the old church and whose active interest in it is yet manifested by the excellent work he has put into the new one.

The dedication sermon was preached by Dr. R. A. Beard, of Fargo, to an audience that completely filled the magnificent new building.

One of the pleasant features was the presence of Mrs. Lois Getchell, of Bismarck, one of the original members of 30 years ago.

Every evening this week has seen its quota of enjoyable events in connection with the dedicatory services.
