Commissioner Rasmusson presented the following resolution and moved its adoption:
Whereas, state and federal money can be expended only on roads which are a part of a state plan and in order to comply with Section 4 of House Bill No. 168, Now Therefore, Be it Resolved, by the Board of County Commissioners of Barnes County, to-wit: That a state road commencing at the northeast corner of Section 31-143-67, thence south and east thru Valley City to the south quarter corner of Section 18-138-56, which is the west corporation line of the town of Fingal, approximately 50 1/2 miles be accepted, and The Board of County Commissioners of said county agrees that the above described roads shall be completed in accordance with the standard specifications which may be required by the U. S. Board of Agriculture, before a petition is submitted requesting that additional roads in the county be included in the state system.
It is agreed that where changes of location may be found necessary such changes are to be made by the State Highway Commission.
It is agreed that the county will, at the request of the State Highway Commission, secure title to such rights-of-way as may be found necessary.
Voting "yes" on above resolution, all members. Voting "no", none.
Commissioner Rasmusson presented the following resolution and moved its adoption:
Be it Resolved by the Board of county commissioners of Barnes County:
That the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) be hereby appropriated and set aside for the purpose of paying, upon the certificate of the state engineer, as chief engineer and secretary of the State Highway Commission, the county's share of the cost of the improvements of about 50 1/2 miles of state roads in Barnes county known as the Green Trail and laid out as per blue print prepared by the secretary of the State Highway Commission and a copy is attached to the original records as filed in the office of the county auditor and State Highway Commission.
Voting "yes" on above resolution, all members. Voting "no", none.
On motion duly seconded and carried the contract of the North Dakota Metal Culvert Co., for furnishing culverts for the ensuing year, was duly signed, accepted and ordered filed, and county auditor instructed to return the certified check.
On motion duly seconded and carried the bond of the North Dakota Metal Culvert Co., amount \$1,000, with the Middlewest Trust Co., as surety, having been approved by the states attorney as to form, was accepted as to sufficiency and ordered filed.
On motion duly seconded and carried the bond of K. C. Schmidt as county surveyor, amount \$500, having been approved by states attorney as to form, was accepted as to sufficiency and ordered filed and recorded.
The balance of the day was spent viewing roads and bridges.
On motion duly seconded and carried the board adjourned to meet at 9 o'clock a. m. Wednesday, May 8th, 1918.

FARMERS PLOW UP WINTER WHEAT

Omaha, May 11--More than 300,000 acres of Nebraska winter wheat have been plowed up because the plant is so badly damaged by drought that it will not pay to harvest it, according to figures just made public by the state bureau of crops. There remains 2,800,000 acres of winter wheat in the state. A 75 per cent yield is predicted from this acreage. Much of the winter wheat ground plowed up has already been planted to spring wheat.
