

SEVERAL STATES REPRESENTED IN FARGO

Fargo, N. D., March 28.—About 800 leading business men of Minnesota, Wisconsin, Upper Michigan and North Dakota, are here today for the fifteenth district Rotarian convention. The club with the best representation is to receive a handsome cup from a local jeweler. Prominent speakers will be: Wm. M. Ryerson, Duluth, president of the district; Hon. Tracy C. Bangs, Grand Forks; Right Rev. Reginald H. Weller, Bishop of Fon-du-Lac, and Melvin A. Brannon, president of Beloit College, Wis., formerly connected with the North Dakota University. Wives of Rotarians will be well entertained by a local committee headed by Mrs. B. Benson, wife of the president of the Fargo club. Uniformed clubs with drum corps, bands and choruses paraded the streets early this morning when the eight car special from Duluth with the neighboring Minnesota and Michigan clubs arrived and the special from the Twin Cities which arrived at 6:30 this morning. Although snappy weather followed the cold wave that succeeded Saturday night's storm it is bright and promise is given of warmer weather. Spurred on the offer of prizes the business places were profusely decorated, although the weather conditions ruined the plans for dressing up the city, in honor of the event. Duluth has either eliminated every other contender for the 1922 meeting, as advance guards have been in the city since last week. The club is represented by W. M. Ryerson, its president and 100 members. In striking uniforms they marched through the streets distributing keys which they claimed "would open anything in Duluth." Perhaps the most startling aggregation was that of the "Red Devils" from Devils Lake, N. D., who received prolonged applause as they marched into the Gardner Hotel this morning making the hotel the conference headquarters. Duluth has started a boom for Norman B. Black as the next district governor to succeed James M. Kayes, of Marquette, Mich., who according to Dotarian rules will not be a contender for that position again. If any other candidates appear, Fargo as the host city, will not push the candidacy of Mr. Black, members declared.

The fifteenth district reflects the complexities of the international Rotary, W. N. Ryerson, president of the Duluth club declared in an address before the convention this morning on the importance of the district in the organization. The social developments of America is practically cross-sectioned in this district. There is no other section of the country that has among its inhabitants such a diversity of peoples so truly representative of every element in America's social structure.

WINTRY BLASTS STOP EASTER FESTIVITIES

St. Paul, March 28.—Bright sunshine today failed to temper the wintry blasts which arrived in time to stop Easter parades and continued today. Temperature near zero is reported in northern Minnesota and a strong north wind reaching the proportions of a gale at times gave no promise of letting up early today. The weather man is predicting fair and warmer. The cold followed a wind-storm Saturday night that resulted in two deaths in southwestern Minnesota. Mrs. Abe Anderson and Mrs. Lewis Dahlberg were fatally injured in the storm near Worthington. The damage today has been estimated at \$200,000. Two children of Mrs. Dahlberg, Eva and Gerard, were perhaps fatally injured in the storm Saturday night near Rushmore. The high school building was slightly damaged at this place. The storm struck after dark and swept a path across Nobles county. The fair buildings near Reading were demolished and many persons injured. munication interrupted. Aid is being sent to the stricken district by Minneapolis and St. Paul civic clubs.

COMMUNISTS ARE FLEEING BEFORE REDS

Hally, Germany, March 28.—Shattered bands of Communists fled through the hilly country surrounding Eisleben today. Safety police were in hot pursuit. The police were supported by artillery which had been concentrated and shelled the camp of the rioters after which the police entered to mop up. Usually they found the Reds had fled. Disorders from minor sources are reported in several nearby cities. More troops will be brought in. The situation is believed to be clearing up.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WINS CASE

Washington, March 28.—The federal government by a decision of the supreme court today won one of the big suits growing out of the federal income tax law by which one hundred million dollars will be kept in the national treasury, as a result of the decision. The court held constitutional the provisions of the law providing as profits the sale of corporation assets—stocks, bonds and other securities as income—and therefore taxable.

TOKIO'S FIRE LOSS TEN MILLIONS

Tokio, Japan, March 28.—Careful estimates of property losses sustained in Tokio's great fire Saturday night indicate today that the total will exceed ten million dollars. Four large business houses, a bank, and other important structures burned in the fire which also destroyed one thousand houses. The Japanese Red Cross have established stations for the relief of those made homeless.

EMPLOYEES LOSE OUT ON WAGE SCALE

Chicago, March 28.—Four thousand employees of the sixty-seven short line railroads today lost out in their fight before the United States railroad labor board for the same pay and working conditions as being enjoyed by the employees of larger railroads.

UNION LABOR TO BUILD OWN HOMES

St. Paul, Minn., March 28.—St. Paul union labor began building homes on its own initiative today. Articles taken out for three corporations which will be used by trade unions in carrying out plans to build houses independently of contractors as a result of wage cuts have been recorded.

Four polled Angus steers have been added to the Agricultural College herd to be used in class work by the stock judging classes at the institution, and will be fitted for exhibition at the International stock exposition in Chicago next December. The steers were purchased by Prof. E. J. Thompson of the animal husbandry department from the Baldwin farms at Ellendale, and were elected to fill in ages which the present college herd has no representative.

Considerable preliminary interest is being evinced in the forthcoming speech of J. W. Brinton, ex-secretary of A. C. Townley, president of the National Nonpartisan league, which will be delivered at the High School gymnasium next Monday evening. A nominal charge is to be made for admission, but the speech promises to be worth the money, as Brinton, in other speeches throughout the state has been revealing some startling inside facts of the nonpartisan league and the chief executives of that organization.
Captain Walter Larson of the High School basketball team entertained the boys of the basketball team and the football squad at a six o'clock dinner last evening at his home. Superiority of some kind had to be striven for, so a contest was unanimously agreed upon to see which of the two factions could eat the most. The decision, it is said, is still in the judge's hands, while several of the contestants are said to be suffering from acute stomach trouble. A pleasant time was enjoyed by the boys, Mr. Larson proving a fit host for the occasion.
Everett G. McGowan, who played baseball with the Valley City baseball team last year, and Norval Baptie finished their three mile skating race at Philadelphia Tuesday night in spectacular form. McGowan touched Baptie as they approached the finish line and the two sprawled on the ice, sliding across the finish line feet first, with arms locked. McGowan's feet were in the lead but the referee called a foul on McGowan and awarded the race to Baptie.

Rehearsal of the play that will be given by the K. of P. lodge this evening was completed for the last time last evening. At the lodge meeting last evening it was announced that considerable paraphernalia had been secured for the occasion, and that everything would be in readiness this evening to give K. of P. members and their wives, friends or sweethearts a royal entertainment. Card playing and pop-corn eating will be another feature of the evening. Come early so as not to miss any of the entertainment.
The Roosevelt Boys Club of Valley City are going to have a kite flying contest Saturday afternoon at two o'clock, the contest to be given on Sugar Loaf hill, east of the city. Two prizes are offered by O. Simenson. The first one is a ball and bat and the second a large box of candy. The flight will be under the supervision of L. W. Hubbard, who will also act as judge. Considerable rivalry is reported to have arisen among the boys of the club as to their superiority in this art since the announcement of the prizes, and a real contest can be looked for.

The funeral of Henrik Andreas Dybdahl, who passed away at 8 o'clock a. m. March 23rd, at his residence in Valley City, from complications of the heart, will be held at 2 p. m. Saturday from Our Saviour's Lutheran church, Rev. V. F. Larson officiating. Mr. Dybdahl was another of Barnes county's pioneers who have passed on to the great reward. He came to America in 1876, and five years later came to Barnes county, where he settled on a homestead. He retired from active farm life some twenty-four years ago, moving to Valley City, where he has since resided. His wife, Mrs. Anna Pederson Dybdahl, is the only surviving relative in America. He leaves three brothers and sisters in Norway to mourn his passing. Interment will be made in the Woodbine Cemetery, of which Mr. Dybdahl for several years past has served as sexton and care-taker.
Easterners, it is said, still believe that transportation is accomplished to a large extent in the Dakota's and some of the other western states by the means of the old type of prairie schooner. county leads the number with 94 trucks registered. Grand Forks county is next with 70. The total number of trucks in North Dakota in 1920 was 1445 or one truck for every 444 people.
