

Devils Lake, N. D., April 1.—R. A. Nestos of Minot, N. D., and Sveinbjorn Johnson of Grand Forks are the selection of the Independent Voter's Association of North Dakota to oppose Governor Lynn J. Frazier and Attorney General William Lemke at the recall election that will be held on November 8.

These selections were made here last night by the recall convention, who had been meeting to decide the proposition of a recall election in North Dakota and to select candidates for the anti-Townley ticket.

Nestos was put before the convention by J. F. T. O'Connor, fusion candidate at the last general election, and endorsed by the I. V. A. Nestos was talked of as a candidate for election to the governorship at the last June primaries, but the Independents meeting at Minot, selected William Langer to head the ticket, and Nestos withdrew very graciously in favor of Langer.

O'Connor, on being nominated for the attorney generalship by A. O. Birchenough, declined and in turn put up the name of his former law partner, Sveinbjorn Johnson, who was nominated.

The Independents also plan to oust the Commissioner. The platform as a whole consists of the seven a candidate for this position was left to the "Committee of 21" with the provision that an American Legion member be selected.

"Rigid Economy" Would Feature Nestos' Regime
Minot, N. D., April 1.—A business administration, "rigid economy" rather than the present "political administration," is the pledge which R. A. Nestos, choice of the convention at Devils Lake yesterday for governor gives to the people of North Dakota if he is elected. He declared he will seek to heal, not tear open the wounds of the past four years.

"I had hoped," he said, "that the present administration would so modify its course that the recall would be unnecessary but when they fail to do so, I am glad a recall has been decided." He complimented the convention on the choice of Sveinbjorn Johnson as attorney general.

Leaguers Ready For Bitter Fight

Fargo, N. D., April 1.—"We are pleased with the decision of the I. V. A. convention at Devils Lake, officials at the state headquarters of the nonpartisan league declared today. "The issue has to be fought out some time so the recall might as well come."

They repeated the charge of "cowardice" made by the league daily paper this morning, as the reason for delaying the recall until November and declared that they would be all the better organized and their "war chest" all the better filled by that time.

None of the executive committee is in town today and it could not be stated that the recall would be extended to all I. V. A. officers but it is said that such "might be presumed to be the case. "A decision on this matter will be reached probably at a meeting of the executive committee here tomorrow at which Mr. Townley will be present.

STAGE ACT MAY PROVE MAN'S GUILT

Superior, Wis., April 4.—The strange action of a boy when a murder scene was enacted on the vaudeville stage here caused police today to hold Robert Van Armon in connection with the murder of Mrs. Marie Davies. Van Armon, when questioned, asserted he was at home the night of the 24th at the time the murder was committed. The woman's assailant thrust a bath towel in her mouth and tied her neck to the bedpost with another.

Ruth Miller and Marie Gray, friends of the murdered woman, attended the vaudeville show. They told police they sat directly behind Van Armon. When the actor on the darkened stage whispered—"I stuck a bath towel down his throat and tied his legs to a radiator," Van Armon groaned and bolted from the theater, the girls said. They followed him and they went down an alley. At the end of the act he returned for his coat and hat, they said. They caused his arrest.

U. S. BACKS ALLIED DEMANDS

Washington, April 4.—The U. S. stands with the governments of the allies in holding Germany morally responsible for the war and obligated to pay full reparations, Secretary of States Hughes declared in a communication presented to the German government. The text of the note from the U. S. to the German government as made public at the state department today, confirming the exclusive United Press dispatch of Saturday that Germany had been notified of the position of the United States.

The communication to Germany was in direct reply to one handed by the German Foreign Minister Dr. Simons to the American Commissioner Dressin at Berlin. This was on March 23 and the American reply was dated March 29. The state department today specifically denied that the communication from the United States was considered a formal note.

ROCKEFELLER'S COUNSEL DIES

Daytona, Fla., April 4.—Star J. Murphy, counsel and personal representative of John D. Rockefeller, died at the hospital here today. His death came following a second operation performed on him in an effort to relieve him of acute indigestion. He was first operated on early last week.
