Chicago, Ill., June 1—Pay slashing, disobedience of the orders of the U. S. Labor Board, the railroad department of the federation of labor prepared for a strike today. This decision followed B. M. Jewell's serving notice on the railroad board that unless they agreed to abide by the rules laid down shop employees will no longer go under their directions. Jewell asserted that the workers should willingly agree to go on strike in the office and the department prepared for it. In spite of this fact the board goes ahead and prepare to cut off another \$50,000,000 off the wages which will affect all shop men following closely upon the slash of a week ago taking \$50,000,000 from the wages of the maintenance of way employees.

ONLY ONE BALLOON MISSING

Milwaukee, Wis., June 3—With 12 of the 13 balloons which started in the navy balloon race here Wednesday accounted for today and only a navy bag piloted by Lieutenant W. J. Reed, of Pensacola, Florida, unaccounted for, Major Oscar Westover according to word received by the Aero Club of Wisconsin early today landed in the woods near Beautechana on Lake St. John, Canada. According to figures compiled by the aero club members Westover covered over 911 miles which is 270 miles short of the world's record. H. E. Cunningham, a civilian, another pilot, landed at Joplin, Mo., covering a distance of 550 miles and a sure entrant in the international balloon race to be held in Switzerland. Aero club officials believe that Reed has landed in some obscure place or may have met with an accident. No word has been received from him since the start. He made a perfect start rising rapidly above the clouds and was lost to view.
