WHEAT MARKET WEAK AT THE OPENING—CLOSES LOWER THAN YESTERDAY.

Wheat Market Weak at the Opening—Closes Lower Than Yesterday.

MINNEAPOLIS, Oct. 2.—The wheat market was weak at the opening then had a sharp upturn of 1 3/4 cents, meeting with selling on the advance.

It was reported that good export business had been done in wheat and oats on this break.

Liverpool was weak and closed 2 to 2 1/4 lower.

Bradstreet's figures on weekly clearances showed wheat and flour clearances equalled 9,445,000 bushels.

Southwest receipts still very liberal. St. Louis today 88,000 bushels; year ago 41,000 bushels; Kansas City today 341,000 bushels, compared with 46,000 bushels a year ago.

CHICAGO CASE.—Chicago cash corn values 1-3/4 higher early but weak. Outside markets averaged lower with St. Louis 2 1/2 to 3 1/2-c lower.

Charters were for 200,000 bushels of wheat and 150,000 bushels of corn at one cent to Buffalo and 100,000 bushels to port Huron and 250,000 bushels of oats on private terms to Georgian bay.

SENTIMENT BEARISH.—Chicago, The Herald says: Sentiment among the grain traders was bearish last night.

There has been a lot of liquidation and some of the commission houses are said to have cleaned up while others have considerable to do. The bearish factor in wheat is the light speculative trade.

Inability to hold all rallies and the continued large receipts. It was the general opinion that the eastern farmer buying early was filled up by heavy sales presumably for the Armour grain company.

While the gossip of the trade is mostly bearish, it is said that a few operators are putting out large lines of short stuff.

Buenos Aires close—Wheat unquoted. Corn 1-4 to 3-8 lower. Flax 1-8 cents lower.

Argentine shipments—Wheat 240,000 bushels against 136,000 bushels last week and 450,000 bushels last year.

Corn 4,808,000 bushels, last week 3,128,000 bushels, last year 5,418,000.
