There was another good increase in the United States visible of 2,933,000 bushels for the past week.

Good export sales were reported to have been made, placing the amount as high as 1,500,000 bushels.

Clearances of wheat and four today equalled 650,000 bushels, of this amount 121,000 bushels was bonded wheat.
