They Are the Attraction This Week

"Isn't that shrew tamed yet?" and "was it Shakespeare who started it?" were questions asked the members of the local committee during this year's lyceum campaign.

There is no comedy on the pages of the world's great literature which has enjoyed the popularity which has been accorded "The Taming of the Shrew." The present staging of the play by the Arden Dramatic company of Shakespearean players can scarcely be called a revival of the world famous comedy for it has never been quite absent from the stage since its first appearance.

The story of the play is a human one, and the playwright found his material for it quite as much in the characters about him as in the old Italian comedy upon which it is based. Indeed, some critics have said that it is a humorous account of Shakespeare's own domestic infelicities. But be this as it may it is certain that the drama is true to life and is so abounding in rich humor that every man and woman should each year be refreshed by its rare good fun.

The Ardens are all players of experience in Shakespearean roles. They are specially chosen for this particular cast.

Miss Mary Tomlinson, who will play the part of Katherine, the shrew, is

at home in this role. She is a versatile actress, and presents a character which is at once strong, convincing and delightful.

Ervin C. Shoemaker in the part of Petruchio will be especially interesting. His intensive study of this unusual figure has given him an understanding of the vagaries of the character which will be surprising.

The company is one of the most luxuriously costumed companies playing Shakespeare on the lyceum stage. They carry their own stage settings and properties.

A rich evening of rollicking laughter may be anticipated by all the lovers of drama.

"The Taming of the Shrew" is the third number of the lyceum course presented by the machine gun company of the N. D. N. A. at the auditorium, on Friday, December 4. The performance begins promptly at 8 o'clock.
