GRINNELL COLLEGE MAN MAY LECTURE

Arrangements are nearly completed to have Prof. B. Spencer, a member of the faculty at Grinnell college in Iowa, appear at the University of North Dakota this month to give two lectures.

Prof. Spencer will appear here under the auspices of the Archaeological Society of America.

He will give two lectures in all probability. The dates for his appearance here will be Wednesday and Thursday, December 16 and 17. His first address will be given on the subject of "Rome and Environs."

The second talk will be on "The Archaeology of America," dealing with Indian remains in the west, with particular reference to the states of Colorado and Arizona.

The first lecture will be illustrated with a large number of views. Both of the talks will be given in the auditorium of Woodworth hall.

Next Saturday morning Dr. E. P. Robertson of Wesley college will deliver the address, while the following week President F. L. McVay will appear on the program. This will be the last convocation before the Christmas holidays and that date is generally reserved for the president to speak.

Convocation programs will be held at 11:30 o'clock every Saturday morning from now until after the annual spring vacation.
