MAY WHEAT IS SLIGHTLY HIGHER

Minneapolis, March 18.—Minneapo- lis May wheat closed 17-8; higher. July wheat 2 1-2c higher, compared with yesterday's closing figures. The wheat market was weak at the opening but turned strong shortly after the opening and before the advance was over the early low point. Reactions were frequent but the market recovered quickly from each set-back and the closing figures are practically at the high point of the day. Clearances of wheat and flour were rather light and the total today was reported as equalling 599,000 bushels. Liverpool cables stated that the Ar- gentine weather caused a little easier feeling there but that millers con- tinued to absorb wheat on the de- cline. It was also reported that less progress was being made at the Dar- danelles and that Indian offers are light again. Weather in the winter wheat belt is very favorable.

Chicago—Domestic demand for cash corn at Chicago remains slow. Demand for cash oats from the sea- board continues unabated. Western markets again made shipping sales.
