

THREE CARDINALS AT CELEBRATION

Anniversary of Catholic University Observed in Unusual Manner.

Washington, March 27.—The twenty-fifth anniversary of the opening of the Catholic University of America was celebrated at St. Patrick's Catholic church here today with the three American cardinals—Gibbons, Farley and O'Connell—in attendance. It was the first occasion on which the three prelates of the church in the United States have officiated simultaneously in a religious ceremony.

Cardinal Farley of New York celebrated the pontifical mass. Cardinal Gibbons of Baltimore, chancellor of the university, preached the sermon. Cardinal Farley of Boston delivered the opening discourse at the academic exercises, which were held at the National theater at 8 o'clock.
