DUDLEY MALONE SAYS ORGANIZED WORK IS DONE

Has Gathered the Evidence Which He Will Submit to Grand Jury.

IS TO DEFEND THE PORT NEUTRALITY

Collector of Port Has Made Number of Secret Tours of Waters About New York and Hoboken—Made Inspection Trip in Naval Boat Today.

WILL AWAIT INSTRUCTIONS. NEW YORK, April 6.—Until he is informed that the president invoked at this port the neutrality resolution of congress covering the furnishing of supplies to belligerent warships, District Attorney Marshall announced that he will take no action on the statement of Dudley Malone, collector of port, that British cruisers on guard off Sandy Hook are being supplied with provisions through boats from this port.

NEW YORK, April 6.—Dudley Malone, collector of port, made a final tour of the New York and Hoboken, N. J., waterfronts before daylight today in his effort to prevent violation of the neutrality act by an organization, which he charges has been formed here to furnish supplies to British cruisers lying off New York.
