

NOT CONSIDERING RECOGNITION OF ANY FACTION NOW

Secretary Bryan Says United States Isn't Ready in Mexican Situation.

CAPTURED OFFICERS REPORTED EXECUTED

Carranza Consul General in New York Receives Advice to the Effect That Villa Forces Have Been Decisively Defeated.

New York, April 29.—Francisco Elias, Carranza consul general here, announced that he had received a cablegram from Carranza stating that the Villa troops were decisively defeated by the constitutionalists at Villafuente, losing 11 officers who were killed and 21 field pieces.

Not Ready to Recognition. Washington, April 29.—The United States is not considering the question of recognizing any government in Mexico, Secretary Bryan declared today when his attention was drawn to the report that the Carranza administration expected early recognition.

Prisoners Executed. Washington, April 29.—Twenty-three Zapata prisoners taken in the battle at Ometusco, including several minor officers, were executed, according to official announcement by Carranza authorities in Vera Cruz, forwarded to the state department.
