

McGUIRE ATTACKED LARIMORE MAN; IS WORSTED IN ROW

Was Then Struck by Harry Trevost and Knocked from the Running Board.

DETAILS LEARNED FROM BOY'S FATHER

Young Man Has Face Badly Bruised—McGuire Tells Little of Affair.

Although R. S. McGuire of 812 North Fourth street, Grand Forks, who was found last night in an unconscious condition on the berm near the Pitger Brewing company's plant, could not or would not give an explanation of the occurrences which led up to his injury, the details of the affair were learned today from Frank Trevost, a prominent resident of Larimore, N. D.

And when McGuire leaves the Grand Forks hospital he probably will be made a defendant in a suit brought by Mr. Trevost, according to the latter.

Harry Trevost, the 18-year-old son of Frank Trevost, has a badly bruised face, as a result of being attacked by McGuire, it is reported from Larimore.

McGuire was injured when he was struck by Harry Trevost, and fell from an automobile driven by young Trevost. Just a moment before this, McGuire, it is alleged, had attacked Trevost three times, and, on one occasion, had knocked him away from the steering wheel. The car swerved into the ditch, it is said, and the fenders were broken. Mr. Trevost declares he will "make McGuire pay for the damages."

According to Mr. Trevost, Mr. and Mrs. McGuire, who spent a month in Larimore, and Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Rock, residents of Larimore, hired his son to drive them to Grand Forks.

When they reached Grand Forks McGuire asked the young man to drive the car to the Pitger brewery. After reaching that place, he wanted to go to an East Grand Forks saloon, and young Trevost refused, whereupon McGuire, it is claimed, climbed upon the running board and started to pummel Trevost. The latter struck McGuire on the face and he fell from the running board onto the berm. He was left there, and last night, about 9:30 o'clock, was found by Captain Hugh Quigley of the East Grand Forks police force.

Young Trevost was attacked three different times, it is said. His lips are badly cut and his eyes are swollen. When asked this morning regarding the accident, McGuire said that he was struck in the face "by a six shooter," but was unable to remember anything further regarding the affair.

Mr. McGuire will recover. His face is badly bruised but there are no cuts or severe wounds.


