The Markets

EXPORT DEMAND IS VERY LIGHT

Minneapolis, Aug. 28.—September wheat closed 7 1/2 higher. December wheat 1 1/4 higher. May wheat 1 1/8 higher. The wheat market was fractionally higher at the start this morning and has ruled rather firm all day. Scattered rains were reported in the northwest and this will hamper threshing operations. Unsettled weather caused some uneasiness among shorts who took some of their profits today.

Showers were forecasted for Illinois, Indiana, Missouri, Wisconsin and Iowa. For Minnesota, the Dakotas, Nebraska and Kansas the prediction was for generally fair and cool weather.

At present the export demand is poor and stocks of wheat within the next thirty days are expected to increase materially, especially in the winter wheat territory.

Scattered light rains were reported in the southwest over night. Premiums on new cash wheat declined today and show a loss from yesterday's closing quotations.
