PROTESTS SENT GREAT BRITAIN

Shipment of Meat From America is Interfered With.

Washington, Nov. 5.—Protests were sent today to the Great Britain state department against the action of the British authorities in interfering with the shipment of American-packing house products on the Norwegian-American steamer Kristianafjord, due to sail from New York tomorrow. The state department holds that interference in the case is unwarranted, as the meat goes to resident buyers in Sweden. The British advance fear that the goods will be shipped into Germany.
