and amount of his alleged claim and lien. (4) Under the pleadings and the proof the excluded testimony was admissible (a) where the landlord had not waived any lien he may have claimed upon the tenant's share for advances; and (b) as bearing upon the intent with which the division was made and acts subsequent thereto was permitted by the landlord, and (c) as proper proof under the pleadings and the issues involved as to the amount the tenant was owing the intervenor if he owed him anything at all.

(5) Plaintiff was entitled to have the foregoing questions submitted to the jury and the direction of the verdict against plaintiff after the proof made was error.

(6) As this appeal determines two actions, the judgments appealed from are ordered set aside and new trials are granted, with plaintiff's costs to be taxed against the intervenor. The elevator companies being more stakeholders, no costs will be taxed against them.
